LONG-RANGE PLAN AVAILABLE FOR STUDY

The Long-Range Planning and Steering Committee has distributed a "discussion draft" of a 25-year plan for Coastal Carolina to each dean or director for faculty feedback. The committee prefers suggestions and comments about the draft in writing.

FEBRUARY 15th is the deadline for submitting your reactions.

Any long-range plan is constantly in flux. The committee reviews and revises annually. Faculty and staff feedback is always welcome, however, deadlines are necessary to produce revisions of the plan within the academic year.

Everyone is urged to contact their dean/director to review the draft and to coordinate feedback within departments. Submit your reactions to your school's committee representative or to Charmaine Tomczyk, Chairman.

A copy of the draft is also available for faculty and student study in Kimbel Library.

KIMBEL LIBRARY HOURS EXTENDED

Due to results of a survey, Kimbel Library hours are being extended for spring semester. Regular hours will be:

A second result of this survey was recognition of the problem of excessive talking and socializing in the library. SINGLETON RECOGNIZED IN U.S. HOUSE

Dr. Edward M. Singleton was recognized for his "significant contribution to the academic world" in the U.S. House of Representatives on Dec. 14.

Singleton, who is retiring at the end of the current academic year after 20 years as the executive officer at Coastal Carolina College, was cited for his accomplishments by Sixth District Congressman John L. Napier who praised Singleton on the floor of the House for "a lifetime of achievement."

"This man, after nearly 40 years in public service, continues to place the highest priority on our educational system," Napier told his House colleagues.

"Chancellor Singleton first assumed the mantle of leadership at the college nearly 20 years ago when the campus first opened," Napier said in remarks printed in The Congressional Record. "He has already proven himself to be a capable educator while serving as superintendent of Conway city schools," he continued.

"The leadership Dr. Singleton has provided in education in South Carolina," Napier said, "will remain as a guiding light to those who follow him."

Napier cited Singleton's professional and educational accomplishments, from his founding of the Conway Recreation Department to his service as Chancellor.

"Mr. Speaker," Napier said, "I would like to take this opportunity to point with pride to a lifetime of achievement by a man who has made a significant contribution to the academic world, Chancellor Edward M. Singleton."

The choir will leave Coastal on May 8th by bus to Washington, then will fly by commercial airline to Hawaii for eight days and seven nights. The choir members will stay in the Napualani Hotel in Hawaii and will be able to enjoy the sun and surf of the 50th state.

The group rate which has been arranged for the choir is also available to students, faculty and staff of the college. The cost of the trip is \$950 per person and includes travel and lodging, but it does not cover the cost of food.
