COLLEGE SPONSORS TOURS TO NEW YORK, OTHER SITES

Encouraged by the success of its popular "Rebels and Redcoats History Tour" of the Waccamaw Region, the Office of Continuing Education at USC-Coastal Carolina College is sponsoring a series of tours to New York City, Colonial Williamsburg, Savannah and New Orleans.

"One of the goals of the Office of Continuing Education is to extend an educational experience to many people in the community," explains Dr. Sally Z. Hare, director of the office. "These low-cost educational tours to various cities in the nation provide a means to allowing citizens to receive a first-hand exposure to the history and culture of our nation at a fraction of what it normally costs to travel to one of these sites."

The first tour is scheduled for Feb. 25-26, and features a weekend in historic Savannah, Georgia. Deadline for registration is February 10th and the cost of the tour is \$165 per person. That fee includes round trip motor-coach transportation from Myrtle Beach to Savannah; two nights lodging at the Savannah Hyatt Regency on the city's waterfront; a guided tour of Savannah's famous historic restoration and free time for shopping or browsing in Savannah's downtown area. It includes baggage handling, taxes, and gratuities. Carriage tours and bicycle rentals are optional.

On April 2, the Office of Continuing Education will sponsor a one-day tour of New York City at a cost of \$175 per person, including transportation. The New York City tour will leave Myrtle Beach in the early morning by motorcoach, travel to Charleston then fly by commercial airline to New York City. Besides airfare and transportations costs, the fee for the New York Tour includes a complete guided tour of New York City. Participants will enjoy a scenic ferry boat ride across New York harbor to visit the Statue of Liberty, then will visit the Empire State Building, the World Trade Center, the theater district, Greenwich Village Wall Street, Times Square, Lincoln Center, Park Avenue, Rockefeller Center, Central Park, Grant's Tomb, Chinatown and other sites. The tour will return on a night flight and motorcoach will escort tour members back to Myrtle Beach the same night.

Deadline for the New York City tour is March 1.

On April 16, the Continuing Education Office will host a tour to New Orleans, which will feature two days in the historic city of jazz and the Mardi Gras. The tour will include a riverboat cruise on the Mississippi aboard the stern-wheeler Natchez; accomodations at the Montelcone Hotel in the French Quarter; dinner at Arnaud's; breakfast at Brennan's; a guided tour of Bourbon Street at night and free time for shopping and sightseeing. The cost of the two-day New Orleans tour is \$360 per person, which includes motorcoach transportation from Myrtle Beach to Charleston, commercial air fare from Charleston to New Orleans, baggage handling and gratuities.

The registration deadline for the New Orleans tour is March 15.

On May 6, the college will sponsor a two-day tour to Colonial Williamsburg, which will include two nights at the famous Williamsburg Inn near the historic area, round trip motorcoach transportation from Myrtle Beach to Williamsburg; dinner at a picturesque colonialera restaurant; breakfast at another Williamsburg restaurant; services of a professional tour guide and admission to all of the attractions of Colonial Williamsburg. The deadline for registration is April 5 and the cost of the Williamsburg tour is \$275 per person.

Senior citizens receive a 10 per cent discount through the professional travel agency which is handling logistics for the tours.

"A lot of people who have taken our "Rebels and Redcoats History Tour" have asked for tours to these places and now we're trying to accommodate them," says Hare. "If these trips prove successful, we will try to expand our tours even more."

Details are available through the Office of Continuing Education at USC-Coastal Carolina College, Hare says.

FACULTY, STAFF ACTIVITIES

Dan Selwa presented a paper entitled "The Rohini Project: Planned City of Metropolitan Delhi" to the 22nd Annual Meeting of the Southeast Conference of the Association for Asian Studies held at Appalachian State University on January 20-22, 1983.

Dr. Carol S. Schramm of the Music Department recently presented two more workshops in an ongoing series for school children. At the Montessori School in Myrtle Beach, she performed on folk instruments and on standard orchestral instruments for students aged eight through ten (who then responded with a concert of their own). At the Conway Elementary School, she demonstrated a variety of flutes and percussion instruments for a second grade class.

Coastal Baseball Coach Larry Carr made two baseball presentations recently at the Westchester Baseball Clinic held in New York City. Other speakers at the clinic included former N.Y. Yankees second baseman Jeff Torbory and Mets star Tom Seaver.

Dr. Richard Dame, of the Department of Marine Science, was a member of the team which recently reviewed the ecosystem research program of the Smithsonian Institution, Chesapeake Bay Center for Environmental Studies on the Rhoad River near Edgewater, Maryland.

AFRICA TRIP OPEN TO FACULTY

The South Carolina Consortium for International Studies, of which Coastal is a member, has submitted a proposal for a grant to send a team of 15 faculty members to Africa from May 12 to July 1, 1983. As a member we are eligible to participate in this project. It is my responsibility to rank the applications from Coastal. Applicants must be full-time faculty with a minimum of two years teaching experience who are willing to incorporate the experiences of the project into existing courses, new courses, and into presentations before college and community organizations. The focus of the project is on Cameroon as a microcosm of Africa, and the visit will include both Anglophone and Francophone areas, forest and savanna, and rural and urban areas. The experience will include living in a village environment with a Peace Corps volunteer.

If a Coastal applicant is selected, the institution will provide the \$300 participant's fee, cover all travel expenses not included in the grant, pay for fees associated with obtaining a passport and pre-trip medical expenses, as well as camera and film and a stipend for the purchase of artifacts as instructional aids. Applicants should expect out of pocket expenditures for supplemental food and drink and souvenirs to run a minimum of \$500.

Application forms are available in Dr. Talbert's office. The deadline is February 15.
