#### CONCERT PIANISTS TO PERFORM TONIGHT

Concert pianists Delphin and Romain will perform in Wheelwright Auditorium at USC-Coastal Carolina College at 8:00 tonight (Monday).

The performance is part of the 1983 Cultural Arts Series at the college. Tickets to the performance are \$5 at the door.

Delphin and Romain began their musical partnership more than 14 years ago during their student days in New Orleans. Their professional career began in 1977, when they made their debut in Carnegie Hall in New York City with the Symphony of the New World.

Since their New York City appearance, they have been featured performers at numerous musical events. They have performed with the Atlanta Symphony and the New Orleans Philharmonic Orchestra. Last month they performed with the New York Philharmonic at Lincoln Center and following their appearance at Wheelwright Auditorium they will return to New York City for another performance.

Delphin and Romain come to Coastal Carolina College as part of the Cultural Arts Series, which is subsidized by the college, the National Endowment for the Arts, the Horry County Higher Education Commission and the Coastal Educational Foundation.

#### **EQUUS OPENS FEBRUARY 18**

The Coastal Carolina College Theatre Series will present the intense psychological drama, "Equus", February 18-20 at Wheelwright Auditorium.

Shows are scheduled at 8:00 p.m., Friday, February 18 & Saturday, February 19, with a 2:30 production Sunday afternoon, February 20. Admission is \$4.00 at the door and advance tickets are on sale at the Wheelwright Auditorium box-office, 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

This play, which is recommended for mature audiences, traces a psychiatrists's investigation into a bizarre crime: An adolescent youth who loves horses inexplicably blinds six of the animals by plunging a metal spike into their eyes.

His act of wanton cruelty has outraged the community in northern England, but the magistrate who hears the case is moved to pity for the disturbed youth. Instead of imposing a sentence on him, she puts him under the care of Martin Dysart, a psychiatrist, who undertakes to force out of the boy's subconscious mind the reasons that drove him to this horrific deed, and thereby relieve his guilt and suffering.

Definately, the boy at first refuses to answer Dysart's question, replying to them with concealing jingles from TV commercials. Then Dysart wins his confidence with a friendly, uncondescending manner.

Thus lured into more open speech, the cunning, semiliterate boy strikes a bargain with his interrogator. He will answer one question for each of his own questions that Dysart will honestly answer. Thus it is revealed that the psychiatrist is himself in trouble emotionally. His marriage is an antiseptic sham and his life is emotionally arid. Who will cure whom?

Dysart is the trained expert, and wins the battle of wills his bag of analytical tricks, including hypnosis and fake truth drugs. On the eve of wrenching out the boy's secrets – his obsessions, fears and sense of mystic deification of horses – the therapist hesitates, out of a philosophical dilemna.

Playing the lead role of Alan Strang is Kevin Ferguson and in the lead role of psychiatrist Martin Dysart is William H. Martin.

#### SEMINAR FOR OFFICE WORKERS AT COASTAL

Secretaries and other office workers will have an opportunity to upgrade their office skills at a special workshop sponsored by the Office of Continuing Education at USC-Coastal Carolina College.

The seminar, entitled "Advanced Seminar for Office Personnel," will be conducted by Dr. Robert S. Kline, D. Ed., who has conducted more than 500 programs and workshops for business executives, office personnel and teachers throughout the nation. "Ninety per cent of an officer worker's responsibility consists of communications and ten per cent are specific professional skills," he says. "The ability to communicate effectively with clients, fellow workers, supervisors and subordinates is often the key to success in fulfilling one's position."

Kline will explain communications barriers and how to penetrate them. He will explore human relations, explaining how to gain confidence in communicating and interacting with others.

He will also deal with time management, providing methods for effective management of time in the office, which is designed to increase productivity and personal satisfaction.

The seminar is scheduled for 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., Friday, February 25 in room 205 of the Student Center.

Cost for the seminar is \$50, with special rates available for groups of three or more people from the same business. Registration may be made by calling the Office of Continuing Education.
