NEW CHANCELLOR NAMED

Dr. Fred W. Hicks, president of Wesleyan College in Macon, Ga., was named Thursday as the next chancellor of USC-Coastal Carolina College. The 49 year-old educator's appointment was announced by USC President Holderman at a meeting of the USC Board of Trustees in Columbia. Hicks will replace Dr. Edward M. Singleton, who retires June 30 after 20 years in leadership at the college.

Dr. Hicks, who has been president at the 400-student Methodist college since 1979, was one of three persons selected from more than 200 applications by a ninemember search committee formed in October.

Dr. Hicks says he doesn't think he will have any problems in transferring from the small private institution to the 2,800-student state-supported school.

"There's the same degree of challenges for both," Hicks says. "As a public institution we will have to turn more to the private sector for funding so I see a lot of similarities."

Hicks, a native of Detroit, has bachelor's and master's degrees in history and holds a doctorate in law and higher education from the University of Michigan.

He held administrative positions at the University of Michigan from 1958-1963 and was director of financial aid at Arizona State University from 1963-64.

From Arizona State, he went to Rollins College in Winter Park, Fla., where he was dean of student affairs and dean of men until he was named assistant chancellor in 1969. Hicks was executive assistant to the president from 1970-76, serving as director of development and public relations, and was named executive vice president in 1977.

While at Rollins, Hicks received master's of science and criminal justice degrees and was awarded an honorary doctor of humanities degree.

He was acting president at Rollins for five months in 1978 before becoming president of Wesleyan in 1979.

Hicks is married and has an 11-year-old son and a sixyear-old daughter.

While in Florida, Hicks was on the board of directors of the Sun First National Bank in Winter Park and on the Council on Arts and Sciences in Orlando.
