## KILPATRICK TO SPEAK APRIL 6

James J. Kilpatrick, the most widely syndicated political columnist in America, will deliver a free public address at USC-Coastal Carolina College in April, college officials have announced.

Kilpatrick will speak in Wheelwright Auditorium at Coastal Carolina College on Wednesday, April 6 at 8 p.m.

He is appearing as the spring speaker for the William A. Kimbel Distinguished Lecturer Series, which is sponsored by the Kimbel Trust, the Episcopal Diocese of S.C., the Myrtle Beach Sun News and USC-Coastal Carolina College. Last fall the William A. Kimbel Distinguished Lecturer Series sponsored an appearance by Art Linkletter and last spring the series speaker was NBC correspondent Irving R. Levine.

Kilpatrick, a native of Oklahoma City, was editor of the Richmond News Leader, one of the South's major newspapers, from 1951-1967 and attracted national attention for his incisive editorials. He became a syndicated political columnist in 1964 and has since become the most widely printed political columnist in the nation.

His regular column, *A Conservative View*, appears in 425 American newspapers. He is a contributing editor to *The National Review* and he is a regular essayist for *Nation's Business*. He appeared for years on CBS-TV's *60 Minutes* as the conservative debater on "Point/Counter-point" and he currently appears on the PBS program *Agronsky and Co.*

His address at USC-Coastal Carolina College on April 6 is free and is open to the public.

## SPRING ARTS FESTIVAL ANNOUNCED

The Fifth Annual USC-Coastal Carolina College Spring Arts Festival will be held at the college on April 6-9, college officials have announced.

Performing artists and musicians from throughout South Carolina will appear at the three-day festival, which is an annual celebration of the arts sponsored by USC-Coastal Carolina College. The numerous activities held on the Coastal Carolina campus April 6-9 will be free to the public, with the exception of a performance by the United Mime Workers theatre group, which is part of the college Cultural Arts Series.

Among the many performers appearing during the festival will be Robert Pruzzin on the french horn, Christopher Berg on guitar and the South Carolina Arts Commission Crafts exhibit. The festival will feature musical performances, crafts, art exhibits, folk dancing, children programs, fairy tale theater an international coffee house and many other attractions.

The popular program has attracted festival-goers from throughout the state and the Grand Strand area in its five-year history. Festival organizers say they think year's festival may be the best yet.
