SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

The Ocean View Memorial Foundation of Myrtle Beach will award academic scholarships again this year to eligible recipients of the Grand Strand Area. The Foundation has awarded more than 150 scholarships to worthy students of the area over the past five years.

Application forms for the scholarship are available from the Chancellor's Office at USC-Coastal Carolina College or from guidance counselors of the high schools in the Grand Strand Area. Scholarship applications should be submitted to: The Chancellor, USC-Coastal Carolina College, Box 1954, Conway, S.C. 29526. The deadline for applications is April 1, 1983.

PROF, GUJER AWARDED GRANT

Dr. Bruno Gujer, Associate Professor of History and Sociology at USC-Coastal Carolina College, has been awarded a \$10,000 grant to conduct historical research in Rimini, Italy during the spring.

Dr. Gujer, a resident of Conway, was awarded the fellowship grant by the Lermite Foundation of Zurich, Switzerland. Under the provisions of the grant he will edit the manuscript of the late Professor Jean-Claude Petitpiere and prepare the late professor's work for publication. The Petitpiere manuscripts will be published as a contribution to the intellectual history of Europe during the early 20th century.

Dr. Gujer, a native of Switzerland, is currently serving as an educational instructor aboard the naval warship U.S.S. *Kidd*, stationed in the Indian Ocean. He is teaching college courses in history and sociology aboard the ship as part of the U.S. Navy's PACE program.
