ALUMNI DIRECTOR NAMED AT COASTAL CAROLINA

Deborah Peterson Schmitt of Myrtle Beach has been named Director of Alumni Affairs at USC-Coastal Carolina College, Chancellor Edward M. Singleton has announced.

A 1976 Magna Cum Laude graduate of Coastal Carolina College, Schmitt is the current president of Coastal Carolina Alumni Association. She holds a bachelor's degree in Business Administration from the college and is married to Myrtle Beach resident Bob Schmitt, a technician at AVX Corporation. As the new Director of Alumni Affairs at the college Schmitt will be responsible for the planning, development and implementation of programs to serve alumni and to maintain alumni interest and support of Coastal College.

"The administration of Coastal Carolina College is very pleased to have Mrs. Schmitt in this important position," says Chancellor Singleton. "She has been a valuable asset to the alumni and to the college in her positions with the Coastal Carolina Alumni Association and we feel she is the perfect choice to serve as the official college liaison with the school's alumni. The alumni of Coastal Carolina College are becoming more numerous every year and Mrs. Schmitt will provide an important service to the college in her role as director of the school's alumni affairs."

A resident of Horry County for the past 13 years, Schmitt was president of the Business Club while a student at Coastal. She was also elected Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities in 1976; received the William A. Kimbel Scholarship; was awarded the Faculty Award for General Excellence in 1976 and was named Miss Coastal in 1974.

"As an alumni of Coastal Carolina College, I have a special interest in the college and I'm glad to be active again at Coastal and within the University of South Carolina System," says Schmitt.

"The alumni of Coastal Carolina College are increasing rapidly. Every year Coastal's graduating class is larger. We now have more than 8,000 Coastal alumni who have either graduated from the college with a bachelor or associate degree or who have been enrolled as students here. We want to maintain contact with as many

of those people as possible. We want to keep them informed of the continuous growth and progressive changes at Coastal and we want to include them in the development of the college.

"Coastal has been important to the alumni and the alumni are equally important to the college," she says. "Through the newly developed Alumni Affairs Office at the college, we hope to continue and expand the role of alumni in the development of USC-Coastal Carolina College."

HOW TO SAVE MONEY WITH COUPONS

Interested in cutting costs at the grocery store? You can get valuable tips on how to save money with grocery store coupons from a special seminar at USC-Coastal Carolina College April 4th.

"Coupons Are Money" is the name of the seminar, which is sponsored by the college Office of Continuing Education at 7:30 p.m., Monday, April 4, in room 107 of the Academic Building at USC-Coastal Carolina College.

"This course is designed to teach the techniques of successful coupon shopping," explains Dr. Sally Z. Hare, the director of Continuing Education at the college. "The instructor will reveal how the so-called 'super shoppers' achieve such astounding savings. She will explain legal shortcuts for effective use of coupons and she will outline practices which should be avoided.

"Even if you are an experience coupon shopper, you could learn some techniques and tips which could substantially increase your savings."

The fee for the seminar is \$8. Hare says each seminar instructor, Cheryl Stevens, is an experienced "super-shopper" expert in coupon shopping.
