KILPATRICK SPEAKS TO FULL HOUSE

The United States and the Soviet Union have to find a way to reduce the number of nuclear weapons, but a congressional nuclear freeze resolution is not the answer, syndicated columnist James J. Kilpatrick said Wednesday.

"The resolution is so wonderfully well-intentioned it's difficult to criticize," he said at a speech at Coastal Carolina College. Yet he called it "regrettable" that an accord with the Soviet Union should be directed by Congress.

Instructions at American arms negotiators in Geneva, Switzerland, should come from the executive branch of government, he said, not the legislative branch.

"This (reduction of nuclear weapons) is the overriding issue, not just before Congress, but for mankind and for civilization as we know it," Kilpatrick said.

Congress, the Supreme Court and potential presidential candidates were all topics of Kilpatrick's wide-ranging comments.

Kilpatrick's address was part of Coastal Carolina College's Kimbel Lecture Series. Sponsored by the Kimbel Trust, Coastal Carolina College, The Sun News and the Episcopal diocese of South Carolina, the series is designed to being nationally recognized lecturers to the Waccamaw-Grand Strand region.

His column, "A Conservative View," appears in 476 newspapers, making Kilpatrick the most widely syndicated political columist in the nation.

Kilpatrick predicted President Reagan would run again in 1984 and sized up his potential political opposition.

The front-running Democrats are all running as other candidates, Kilpatrick quipped.

Sen. John Glenn is running as former President Dwight Eisenhower, Gary Hart of Colorado thinks he's John Kennedy and former vice president Walter Mondale is campaigning as Hubert Humphrey, Kilpatrick said. Alan Cranston of California, he added, looks a lot like E.T.

Mondale is leading the pack of Democrats, but Kilpatrick predicted he wouldn't stay in that position long because his opponents were out to stop him. "Politics is a body contact sport," Kilpatrick said.

Sen. Fritz Hollings, D-S.C., expected to toss his hat in the ring this month, would make a promising candidate for vice president, Kilpatrick said.

The public will probably know whether Reagan will run again by Labor Day, he added.

Though noted for his political observations and reporting, Kilpatrick declined any political aspirations of his own. 'When the feeling hits, I lie down until it goes away," he said.
