## PRESIDENT'S ROUNDTABLE FORMED

The Coastal Carolina Alumni Association has recently formed a new organization known as the President's Roundtable. The President's Roundtable will consist of all past presidents of the Alumni Association, the current president and the Alumni Director of the college. The organization will serve as an advisory council to the Alumni Association.

"There are many times during the year that the Board of Directors of the Alumni Association could use guidance and advice on various events that we plan", says Debbie Schmitt, current president. "What better place to look for this help than our past presidents who have obtained the experience and expert knowledge that can be priceless to our alumni".

The first meeting was held March 21 during a noon luncheon on Coastal's campus. During this meeting Clark Parker was elected chairman for 1983-84 year. Mr. Parker, a 1977 graduate of Coastal, served as president in 1978 and was elected for a second term in 1979. He is now an accountant with Llola Gore, C.P.A. in Conway.

Other members in the Roundtable are Fred Haithcock of Durham, N.C., the founding president in 1976 and 1977; Steve Lee of Conway, 1980 president; William Alford of Myrtle Beach, 1981 president; Ruthie Kearns of Myrtle Beach, 1982 president; and Debbie Schmitt of Myrtle Beach, 1983 president and Alumni Director at Coastal.

## THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE AT COASTAL APRIL 20

Tickets are now on sale for North Carolina Opera's performance of Gilbert and Sullivan's THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE scheduled for Wheelwright Auditorium at USC-Coastal Carolina College, Wednesday, April 20 at 8 p.m. Tickets are \$12.50 and are now available at the Wheelwright Box Office during normal office hours.

One of America's favorite Gilbert and Sullivan operas, THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE tells the story of the dutiful young Frederic who has joined a band of pirates through the mistake of his nurse, Ruth. Frederic's parents meant for him to be apprenticed as a "pilot" but Ruth misunderstood them as wishing him to be a "pirate".

His predicament is related with wit and humor in THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE as Frederic first becomes a pirate, then a pirate fighter, and once again, resigns himself to being a pirate.

The continuing hit production is performed by six principal singers, members of the Charlotte Symphony Orchestra and Charlotte Opera Chorus.

Joanna Levy, Ruth, is an accomplished recitalist as well as a gifted operatic performer. Since her debut with the New York City Opera, she has continually delighted audiences throughout the Northeast. Ralph Griffin, The Pirate King, first came into prominence when the national press praised his vocal talents in the celebrated dueling scene of Berlioz's rarely heard opera BENVENUTO CELLINI. He made his debut with the Houston Grand Opera, Greater Miami Opera, Kentucky Opera and Cincinnati Opera.

Michael Riley as the Sergeant of Police, is a versatile performer with more than 80 operatic roles and 50 orchestral works to his credit. For six seasons he was a member of the Minnesota Opera Company where he earned critical acclaim and was seen nationally over the Public Broadcasting System.

In addition to a cast of six principal artists, the production will tour with members of the Charlotte Symphony Orchestra and Charlotte Opera Chorus. Stage direction is by David Gately and Music Director is Charles Rosekrans.

North Carolina Opera's purpose is to take fully staged opera with orchestra, chorus and nationally-known singers to communities that do not have the opportunity to see live opera, or see live opera, or see it only on a limited basis.

## POLICY FOR RETURN OF STATE VEHICLES

If the gates are open upon return, park the vehicle in the fenced parking area and drop the keys, credit card, and vehicle paperwork through the mail slot in the front door of the maintenance building.

If the gates are closed and the security personnel are not available, park the vehicle in the driveway in front of the maintenance building, lock the car, drop the key, credit card and vehicle paperwork through the mail slot of the maintenance building. It is very important that the key be dropped in the maintenance building so that security personnel can later move the vehicle inside the fenced parking area.

## CAMPUS SECURITY INFORMATION

The Campus Services Committee would like to announce that the beeper system and beeper phone numbers, 626-6963 and 248-6963, are no longer in use. If you are on campus, you may contact a security guard after 5 p.m. by dialing the guards' booth (ext. 211) or by coming to Kimbel Library during its operating hours to have a staff member page a guard via two-way radio. There is no direct line to the guards' booth which means that after 5 p.m. Monday-Friday and all day Saturday and Sunday the booth cannot be reached from off campus. However, by dialing the pay phone directly behind the guards' booth (347-6713) it may be possible to contact a security guard. The best times to reach a guard are at 5 p.m. Monday-Friday, when one comes on duty and at 4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, when the shift changes.
