WOMEN'S CONFERENCE TAKING RESERVATIONS

Registration is now being taken for the statewide Conference on Women, scheduled for Saturday, April 30 at USC-Coastal Carolina College. The conference, sponsored by the Office of Continuing Education at the college and by Belk of Myrtle Beach and Belk of Conway, will present a variety of subjects of interest to women.

"This isn't an ordinary conference on women," says Dr. Sally Z. Hare, Director of Continuing Education at USC-Coastal Carolina College. "Even the name was selected carefully - a conference **ON** women, not simply **FOR** women. This conference will be of interest to every woman: women with careers, women who are homemakers, single women, married women, women of all ages, women of all interests -- and to men who are interested in women.

"The topics are current issues, useful skills and valuable information," she says. "The setting is informal and we believe the conference offers something for everyone."

The conference begins with registration and coffee at 8:30 a.m., Saturday, April 30 and continues until 5 p.m. The conference will be held on the campus of USC-Coastal Carolina College, with registration in Wheelwright Auditorium. The conference fee is \$40, which includes lunch and refreshments.

Opening the conference will be keynote speech entitled "Is there Really a Psychology of Women?" by Betsy Puskar, Assistant Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs at Coastal Carolina College. Concurrent sessions Saturday morning will include: "Women and Legal Issues" by Family Court Judge Judy Bridges; "Career Decisions: The Fork in the Road" by Dr. Hilda Dail; "Money Matters Making Your Dollars Work" by Beth Haynes; "The Dynamics of a Relationship Between the Sexes" by Dr. Paul Stanton; "A Technique for Stress Reduction" by Charles Diggett; "And Jill Came Tumbling Down: Sexism in Education" by Bob Watson.

Concurrent afternoon sessions include: "Women and Legal Issues" by Family Court Judge Judy Bridges; "The Power of the Vote: Women and Politics" by state Democratic party Vice Chairperson Marsha Duffy; "Money Matters: Making Your Dollars Work" by Beth Haynes; "The Dynamics of a Relationship Between Sexes" by Dr. Paul Stanton; "Women and Medical Issues" by Dr. Harriett R. Steinert; "Speaking Publicly: How to Do it Better" by Cynthia Hodell; "On the Road Again: Tips for the Woman Traveler" by Jenny McKay; "The

Power of the Vote" by Marsha Duffy; "Coping Skills for Mothering: How to Handle Peanut Butter, Jelly and Guilt" by Marcy Leiter; "Frauds, Schemes and Ripoffs: Woman as Consumers" by State Consumer Affairs official Brandolyn Clanton; "Women and Medical Issues" by Harriet Steinert; "Body Talk: What Your Body Is Saying" by Cynthia Hodell and "The Total Person: Woman Living Beyond Her Stereotyped Role" by Hilda Dail.

Registration for the conference may be made by contacting the Office of Continuing Education. Faculty and staff may attend the conference for a discounted fee of \$25. Coastal students will be admitted for \$5.

COASTAL STUDENT HOLDS VOICE RECITAL

Clifford Smith, II, a senior at Coastal Carolina College, will present a voice recital on Monday, April 25th at First United Methodist Church in Conway at 8:00 p.m.

Smith began the serious study of music at Furman University in 1978. He was a member of both the Furman Singers and the SLBC Gospel Choir there. Then he transferred to Coastal where he began voice training with E. Carter Breeze.

Smith has placed first in a talent show at the Myrtle Beach Air Force Base, and recently performed solo in both the USC Concert Choir's Spring Concert and in the Intercollegiate Choral Festival at Columbia. He has performed in "The King and I," "The Mikado", "Anything Goes", and "Hello Out There".

The 22-year-old artist desires to perform classical music professionally, although he is versatile enough to also perform popular songs. His recital is open to the public at no charge.
