NEW CHANCELLOR TO MAKE COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

Dr. Fred W. Hicks, the newly appointed chancellor of USC-Coastal Carolina College, will deliver the keynote address to graduates at the 1983 Coastal Carolina College commencement.

The school's 1983 graduation exercise is scheduled for 10:30 a.m., Saturday, May 7 in Kimbel Gymnasium. College officials say 212 students will receive undergraduate degrees and eight students will be awarded master's degrees. Commencement is open to the public.

The address by Hicks will be his first public speech in the Waccamaw-Grand Strand region of South Carolina. Hicks is currently president of Wesleyan College in Macon, Georgia. He was one of three candidates for the chancellor's position selected by a college search committee from a field of more than 200. Hicks was selected from the top three candidates by Dr. James Holderman, President of the University of South Carolina. As the newly appointed chancellor of Coastal Carolina College, Hicks is replacing Dr. Edward M. Singleton, who is retiring from the chancellor's post after 20 years as head of the 29 year-old institution.

Hicks has been president of Methodist-related Wesleyan College since 1979. Before his tenure as head of Wesleyan he was executive vice president at Rollins College in Winter Park, Fla., where he also served for a period as acting president. He came to Rollins College in 1964 as director of student affairs. He became assistant chancellor, then executive assistant to the president before becoming executive vice-president - a position he held for almost three years before assuming the presidency at Wesleyan College. In the early 1960's, he served as director of financial aid at Arizona State University, assistant director of financial aid at the University of Michigan and as assistant to the vice president for public relations and development at the University of Michigan. He also served on the faculties of Arizona State and Rollins College as a professor of history.

A native of Detroit, Hicks holds a Ph.D. in Higher Education from the University of Michigan, an M.A. in History from the University of Michigan, an M.S. in Criminal Justice from Rollins College, an A.B. in History from the University of Michigan and an L.H.D. from Rollins College.

He has served on the Board of Directors of C&S National Bank in Macon; on the Board of Directors of the American Red Cross of Macon; on the Board of Trustees of the Macon Historic Preservation Heritage Foundation and as director of Sun First National Bank of Winter Park. He was chairman of the Board of Trustees of Winter Park Public Library; served as chairman of the Civil Service Board of the City of Winter Park and was a member of the Board of Trustees of Winter Park Memorial Hospital.

He will assume the position of chancellor of USC-Coastal Carolina College on July 1.

ALUMNI DEFEAT FACULTY

The Coastal Carolina Alumni Association was victorious over the Faculty-Staff during the sixth annual Faculty-Alumni Softball Game Monday 25th. An alumni win of 8 - 7 tied the scores for total games with the alumni and faculty each winning three games.

George Martin pitched six complete innings and Clark Parker pitched three innings in relief for the winners. Coach Steve Taylor pitched for the Faculty Team.

The scoring was balanced throughout the game. The alumni jumped to an early 3 - 0 lead before the faculty could muster any offense. However the Faculty tied the score in the bottom of the third. The game remained tied going into the eighth inning. Then the alumni took advantage of a fielding error and with some skillful base running, scored the winning run. The faculty threatened in the bottom of the ninth with two men on base and two outs. A grounder hit by Randall Cox to James Beck retired the faculty for another year. Later one faculty member was heard to say, "It was a case of the faculty being clearly outcoached by the alumni!!"

POLICY FOR RETURN OF STATE VEHICLES

If the gates are open upon return, park the vehicle in the fenced parking area and drop the keys, credit card, and vehicle paperwork through the mail slot in the front door of the maintenance building.
