Health Services is warning students and others in the Coastal community to take precautionary measures to warn off seasonal flu. Influenza - commonly shortened to "the flu" - is an extremely contagious viral disease that appears most frequently in winter and early spring. The infection spreads through the upper respiratory tract and sometimes invades the lungs. Classic symptoms are fever, chills, bodyaches, headache, and fatigue lasting 3 to 4 days, sometimes followed by a dry cough, sore throat and runny nose for about another week.

Five to 20 Americans will come down with the flu each year. The respiratory illness is caused by viruses that spread from person to person by sneezing or touching something with the flu virus on it (doorknobs, phones, etc.)

Tips to ward off the extremely contagious viral influence include: wash your hands often, use alcohol-based antibacterial hand sanitizer when soap is not available and get a flu shot.

Lamonica Yates in Human Resources said flu shots will be available for CCU faculty and staff but a date has not yet been determined. It usually occurs in late October or November, she said.
