PERSONNEL CHANGES AT COASTAL CAROLINA COLLEGE

The Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs at USC-Coastal College, Dr. Roy Talbert of Conway, has announced plans to resign his administrative post and return to the college faculty as a professor. Talbert's resignation and several other college personnel changes were announced Tuesday following a Dean's Council by Dr. Fred Hicks, the Chancellor of Coastal Carolina College.

"Dr. Talbert is a fine teacher and scholar who has provided strong leadership in the academic life of the college for the last four years," says Hicks. "It is his desire to return to his primary interest, teaching, and I accept his decision with regret and with appreciation for his accomplishments as Vice Chancellor. He will be an asset to the School of Social and Behavioral Sciences, in which he has already been teaching history courses."

Hicks says he has established a committee to search for a new Vice Chancellor, which he describes as the second most important position in the college administration. A national search will examine candidates from within the college community and from across the nation, according to Hicks.

A native of Cheraw, S.C., Talbert came to Coastal Carolina College from Ferrum College in Ferrum, Va., where he served five years as an administrator and instructor. Prior to assuming his duties with Ferrum College, Talbert served as an intelligence officer with the U.S. Army in the Pentagon. He holds a Ph. D. and a Master's degree in History from Vanderbilt University and a Bachelor's degree from Furman University.

In further administrative changes confirmed at the Monday meeting, Dr. Janis Chesson has been appointed Assistant Chancellor for Academic Affairs and will be responsible for academic and non-academic personnel. She will also continue her current post as Affirmative Action Officer for Coastal Carolina College.

A native of Russellville, Alabama, Dr. Chesson holds a Ph. D. from N.C. State University and an undergraduate degree from East Carolina University. She has been a member of the Coastal Carolina College faculty since 1979, and is an Associate Professor of Sociology.

Hicks also announced the appointment of Dr. Sally Z. Hare as Assistant Chancellor for Academic Affairs for Graduate Studies and Continuing Education, with responsibility for developing expanded programs in Continuing Education and Graduate Studies on and off the college campus. Hicks says Hare will be in charge of establishing several new educational centers at various sites in the Grand Strand region, provided easier access to classes for evening and graduate students.

Dr. Hare, a native of Charleston, S.C., is Associate Professor of Education and Director of Continuing Education and Graduate Programs at the college. She holds a Ph. D., a Master's degree and a Bachelor's degree from the University of South Carolina, and has been a faculty member since 1971.

Also confirmed in a new appointment at the college was Dr. Elizabeth Puskar, who will assume the position of Assistant Chancellor for Academic Affairs in Student Support Programs and Faculty Development. A native of Pittsburgh, Pa., Dr. Puskar joined the Coastal Carolina College faculty in 1974 and is ranked as Associate Professor of Psychology.

She holds a Ph.d. and a Master's degree in Counselor Education from the University of Pittsburgh and an undergraduate degree from Indiana University of Pennsylvania. In addition to teaching and administrative duties, she has served as a counselor for students and faculty -- a service she will continue to exercise, Hicks says.

Dr. Talbert's resignation as Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs will become effective at the end of the current academic year. The other administrative changes will become effective immediately.

In Memorial To Devlin Michael Warren And The Benefit Of All Premature Babies

Devlin Michael Warren, son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Warren, died not because of disease or old age but because of prematurity. Devlin was four months premature, born August 7, 1983, weighing only one pound six ounces. According to doctors at Presbyterian Hospital in Charlotte, North Carolina, he was not expected to live even one day, yet he survived for five weeks.

Baby Warren was under extensive care and he required approximately one unit of blood everyday, using a total of thirty-five units. What one must understand is that a premature baby does not have the capability of replenishing his own blood; therefore he must be constantly monitored in order to keep his oxygen level normal. The only accurate way to accomplish this is, every two to four hours a sample of blood is taken from the baby causing a temporary depletion until he receives an available unit.

Your donations of blood will be greatly appreciated by Mr. and Mrs. Warren and the American Red Cross. It will also aid in the future care of all premature babies and other individuals who are in need of supply.
