Faculty and staff IDs will be distributed in Atheneum Hall January 23 to 27 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

A photo ID must be presented to receive a new card so that one person may not pick up another person's card.

The old ID card will no longer work in the dining service areas. Meal plans will be accessible only with the new Campus ID Card.

**Dawn Hitchcock** has been named interim director of Financial Aid. A Coastal graduate (1994 with a bachelor's degree in computer science), she joined the ITS department in

1996, then became associate director of Financial Aid. Before coming to CCU, Hitchcock worked for New South, Inc.

An article by **Jo-Ann Morgan** titled "Thomas Satterwhite Noble's Mulattos— From Barefoot Madonna to Maggie the Ripper" has been accepted for publication in the *Journal of American Studies*, published by Cambridge University Press. Morgan discusses two paintings about slavery by Thomas Satterwhite Noble, a 19th century American artist from Kentucky. In total, Noble painted six paintings on this theme, one of which, "Fugitives in Flight," can be seen at the Greenville (SC) Museum of Art.

**Barbie Norvell-Hall,** assistant professor of early childhood education in the Spadoni College of Education, presented a paper entitled "Does Body-Coda or Onset-Rime Blending Better Help Kindergarteners Decode Words?" at the National Reading Conference in Miami, Fla., Nov. 29 to Dec. 2.

Nancy Ratcliff, assistant professor of early childhood education in the Spadoni College of Education, recently presented at the national conference of the National Association for the Education of Young Children held in Washington, D.C., Nov.7-10. Her presentation "The Music-Literacy Connection: How to use the music of Thomas Moore to Foster the Development of Literacy Skills" was attended by more than 200 conferees from across the nation. On Oct. 10 and 11, Ratcliff also was invited by the South Carolina Department of Education to serve as a trainer for 45 persons from across the state seeking to become qualified NCATE reviewers. In this state leadership role, Ratcliff provided participants with training on the new NCATE assessment and evaluation system and also served as chair of a SCDE review team for three early childhood programs seeking state accreditation.

**Jim Tully** is the new state chair of the College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA), a national organization of college and university band directors and other entities and individuals in the profession. CBDNA is devoted to the advancement of the artistry and professionalism of collegiate band programs. The state chair is responsible for the annual South Carolina Collegiate Honor Band, overseeing the state commissioning consortium, and presiding at all official meetings and functions.
