CEF HAS NEW PRESIDENT, OFFICERS

The administrator of Loris Community Hospital, Frank M. Watts, has been selected as the new president of the Coastal Educational Foundation, the non-profit support group which founded Coastal Carolina College in 1954 and continues to support the college. Watts' new post was announced by Dr. Fred W. Hicks, the chancellor of Coastal Carolina College. "Frank is the latest in a succession of talented, dedicated citizens who have served in the presidency of the important foundation, Hicks says. "The challenges facing Coastal Carolina College as we move into the future are exciting and numerous. I believe Frank Watts will continue the legacy of leadership established by past presidents and will make a meaningful contribution to Coastal Carolina College and to our community."

Watts assumed his newly elected position from the former president of the Coastal Educational Foundation, Jimmy Johnson of Conway. Also newly elected to positions on the foundation are Rodney Propps of Myrtle Beach, Vice President, and Clay Brittain of Myrtle Beach, Secretary-Treasurer.

A native of Horry County, Watts graduated from Aynor High School, and attended Berry College in Rome, Georgia and Columbia University School of Public Health and Administration Medicine in New York City. He has conducted additional study at the University of Chicago.

For ten years, 1958-1968, he served as assistant administrator of Conway Hospital. Since 1968, he has served as administrator of Loris Community Hospital and Extended Care Facilty in Loris. He is currently a member of the board of trustees of the S.C. Hospital Association and a member of the Management Advisory Board of the Carolina Hospital Improvement Program. He is a former trustee of the S.C. Nursing Home Association and a former president of the Pee Dee Council of Nursing Home Administration. He presently serves as member of the board of directors of the Little River Medical Center. He is administrative board chairman of Loris United Methodist Church and is first vice-president of the Loris Lions Club. He is also a member of the advisory board of the National Bank of South Carolina and formerly served as vicepresident of the Coastal Educational Foundation.

He is a veteran of the U.S. Army and now lives in Loris. He and his wife, Sylvia, have two children.

The new vice president of the Coastal Educational Foundation, Rodney Propps of Myrtle Beach, is a native of West Virginia and is the president and chairman of Justice Builders, Inc. of Myrtle Beach. He holds an MBA degree in Economics from the University of Maryland; has served as director of People's Savings and Loan Association in Conway and as a member of the board of advisors of Brookgreen Gardens.

The new secretary-treasurer of the Coastal Educational Foundation, Clay Brittain of Myrtle Beach, is a native of Winston-Salem, N.C. An alumnus of the University of North Carolina, he is the owner of the Chesterfield Inn in Myrtle Beach, the Sea Captain's restaurants in Myrtle Beach and Murrells Inlet and is active on the management of Grand Strand motels and golf courses. He is a member of the board of directors of the South Carolina National Bank; he is president of Golf Holiday; he is a member of the Ocean View Memorial Foundation and serves on the board of Epworth Children's Home. He has been actively involved in the development of Coastal Carolina College and as been an active officer in the Coastal Educational Foundation.

Each officer serves a term of one year on the foundation.
