LIBRARY SERVICES

All faculty and staff are eligible for free computor searches which identify funding sources for research and other sponsored projects. To take advantage of this trial service, you must first obtain an "individual authorization slip" by calling Arlene McWhorter at the USC Office of Sponsored Programs and Research (SPAR), ext. 7093. Bring this authorization with you to Kimbel Library and complete a computer search request with one of the reference librarians.

The search will be conducted by a librarian at the Library Processing Center at USC-Columbia. The result of the search will be a print-out of appropriate funding sources with a brief description of the foundation and the types of grants awarded. Search results are usually received within two weeks.

FAMILY FUND CAMPAIGN NEARS AN END

The College's annual Faculty-Staff Campaign is scheduled to end November 15. PAPERS PRESENTED

Charles Joyner, History, will present a paper on "The Waccamaw Region: Environment, Economy, and Human Values in Two South Carolina Counties" at the Annual Meeting of the Southern Historical Association in Charleston on November 9-12.

Dr. Walter D. Stanaland attended an Internattional Conference on High Voltage Breakdown and Dielectric Phenomena, from October 16, 1983 until October 20, 1983. During the conference, he presented and defined a paper, entitled "Parameters and Limits of Bipolar Conduction Theory With AC Excitation." The conference was sponsored by the IEEE and the Electrical Insulation Society. More than twelve countries were represented at the conference, and a variety of papers were presented by a representatives from more than ten countries. For the first time, at this annual conference, almost thirty percent of the representatives were for biological disciplines and their papers generally reflected the dielectric characteristics of human tissue and plant membrane.
