Faculty members whose students do outstanding research papers in British literature, history, music or philosophy, should keep in mind the annual competition of the Carolinas Symposium for British Studies with awards for the best graduate and undergraduate papers in British Studies. A \$50 honorarium and listing in the program go to the winners in both graduate and undergraduate categories and the students will have the opportunity to read their papers at the C.S.B.S. conference next October at Appalachian State University. Honorable Mention winners are also listed in the program. For each of the past two years a Coastal Carolina College student has won an award in the undergraduate division!

ALCOHOL CONFERENCE IN MARCH

Arrangements are being made for the first South-eastern Regional Conference on "Alcohol on the College Campus" March 8-9, 1984. This conference will be hosted by the University of South Carolina at Spartanburg.

"A number of exciting and practical programs are being planned. Programs are being included which will be of interest to both two and four-year institutions, public and private institutions, commuter and residential campuses," says Leon E. Wiles, Dean of Students and Conference Coordinator at USC-Spartanburg. Anticipated registration costs will range between \$25 to \$50. SGA PRESIDENT RESIGNS

Harry W. Rogers, President of the Student Government Association, has announced his resignation from that position effective December 16, 1983. Ms. Lynne Radcliffe, currently Vice President of SGA, will become President as provided under the SGA constitution. Harry Rogers will become a part-time student during the second semester and, therefore, is not eligible to serve in that position. Dr. Bob Squatriglia, Dean of Students, noted that "Harry Rogers has served his fellow students on the campus in many ways and has contributed significantly to the quality of campus life."

OPPORTUNITIES TO STUDY ABROAD

The International Program of Coastal will provide a limited number of incentive scholarships to qualified students who wish to complement their education at Coastal by studying abroad for a summer, or even a whole academic year. Grants depend upon funds available, but should be around \$500 for a summer project and \$2,000 for a whole year abroad.

To be eligible, a student should have completed at least 30 semester hours at Coastal with an average of 2.5 or more, and present a proposal involving an accredited program abroad, the credits to be transferable to Coastal. The location and scope of the program is entirely left to the discretion of the student, but the Director of the International Program will gladly advise all interested students about the opportunities available. Proposals involving the learning of or studies in a foreign language will be given preference, particularly if a student has engaged successfully in the study of a foreign language at this institution.

The deadline for the submission of proposals is January 31, 1984. Faculty are requested to kindly encourage select students to participate.
