CAROLINA VENTURE FUND

The University of South Carolina Educational Foundation is pleased to announce the establishment of the Carolina Venture Fund, a new \$50,000 program which will provide support for a variety of innovative and creative faculty projects, effective January 1, 1984.

This fund is intended to assist faculty with promising efforts to develop new technology, new research procedures, or significant improvements in research and technology, new research and technology but the development of which involves some risk or uncertainty. It will be administered by the Provost who will be assisted by a committee which will meet in February, May and December of each year. Applications will be accepted by the committee throughout the year and applications received by the 15th of the month preceding committee meetings will be considered.
