FACULTY/STAFF ACTIVITIES

Ed Cerny, Business, participated in the Heart Fund Telethon presenting facts on "Exercise" February 5 at the Santee Cooper Auditorium in Myrtle Beach. He also gave a presentation on "Education and the Media" to the Grand Strand High School Teachers, on February 2 at Coastal. Mr. Cerny presented a four week workshop for the advertising staff of the Sun News, and gave a speech on "Marketing of a Tennis Pro" at the Southeast Regional Conference meeting on February 10.

Eddie Dyer, Social and Behavioral Sciences, held a workshop for local officials of the City of Georgetown, Georgetown County, and Waccamaw Regional Planning Council on January 24. The workshop dealt with the powers, duties, and responsibilities of zoning boards of adjustment and was aimed at preventing litigation over application of land-use controls by local government.

Tim Touzel, Education, gave a presentation at the annual meeting of the South Carolina Council of Exceptional Children on February 4. The title of this speech was "Error Patterns in Mathematical Processes of Mildly//Moderately Handicapped Students." On February 6, he presented two programs for primary and upper elementary teachers in the Pee Dee service area on the topic of "Problem Solving in Mathematics."

Susan Libes, Assistant Professor of Marine Science, has been nominated for recognition as an Outstanding Member of the University community by Chancellor Fred Hicks. "The Night Thoreau Spent in Jail," a play that dramatizes an actual historical incident with striking parallels to our own times, is to be presented by the Coastal Carolina Theatre as the third play of its 1983-84 play season in the Wheelwright Auditorium for three performances on February 24, 25, and 26. Performances scheduled for Friday and Saturday, February 24 and 25 will be at 8:00 p.m. A matinee performance is scheduled at 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, February 26. Tickets are \$4 at the door and the box office is open weekdays from 1:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m. It is an absorbing play about a man who invented the phrase "march to a different drummer" - and then did it. A vivid drama about the rebel who staged the first and perhaps most famous act of civil disobedience in American history.
