Call for proposals announced

The Spring 2006 call for proposals for the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning Grants is now available at: http://www.coastal.edu/cetl/sotl/SOTLCFPspring2006.pdf Proposals are sought for research projects on methods of student learning from both individual faculty (\$3,500 max) and groups of faculty (\$7,500 max).

There are a few significant differences in the application process this year:

- The submission process is completely online at http://www.coastal.edu/cetl/sotl. All that needs to be turned in as paper copies are the signature pages.
- Applications must be accompanied by a completed Institutional Review Board "Research Projects Containing Human Subjects" application. Almost all SOTL projects will qualify as exempt from this process, but the application must be filed to certify that.
- If you are budgeting yourself a stipend for this project, you must let us know which semester or summer session you wish to receive it. The initiation of that paperwork now comes from the CETL; we will send the form needed at the beginning of the semester.
