Before writing her first book, I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings, Ms. Angelou was a nightclub performer in Porgy and Bess on a 22-country tour of Europe and Africa. She speaks six languages. Coastal Carolina Chancellor Fred Hicks said, "Ms. Angelou's life represents a wellspring of talent well-used to enrich people's lives. Coastal is fortunate to have her on campus." The search for a Vice Chancellor resulted in approximately 260 nominations, recommendations, and applications. SOUTH CAROLINA STATE EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION

SCSEA is a voluntary membership organization composed solely of state employees and retirees. For 35 years the association has been representing state employees and retirees before the legislative and executive branches of government. It is our only independent voice. SCSEA has obtained significant gains for state employees and retirees. Here are some of the most recent achievements the association has accomplished on your benefit: 1982- SCSEA was successful in having Governor Riley's veto of the 2% merit and 5% longevity raises over-ridden for fiscal year 1982-83, which gave employees \$6.5 million they would not have received had the veto held.

1983 - Cost-of-living raise of 5%; longevity provided annually by the Retirement System; passage of a revised holiday schedule with the same number of holidays as the previous schedule; doubling in the amount of sick leave employees may carry over from one year to the next from 90 days to 180 days. The total dollar cost for these benefits equals nearly \$40 million.

1984 - During the legislative session, SCSEA will lobby for a 9% cost-of-living raise along with longevity raises and restoration of the merit increment program. The association's lobbying effort will also include establishment of a dental insurance program, along with other things.

State employees and retirees need to be aware that SCSEA lobbies to prevent reductions in state employee and retiree benefits. Legislation was defeated that would have permitted agencies to furlough employees up to eight days without pay.

Membership in the association must increase so that state employees and retirees will have an even stronger voice in state government and accomplish even more. For further information and application forms, contact Lindy Smith, ext. 268.
