## **MATHEMATICS CONTEST SET FOR FRIDAY**

The School of Mathematics/Computer Services and the School of Education, along with the Horry-Georgetown Mathematics Advancement Council and the Coastal Educational Foundation, will be sponsoring their 6th annual mathematics contest for the local area high school students on March 29, 1984.

The contest will consist of two levels of proficiency. The first level will include questions from Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II, and the second level will include questions from Algebra, Geometry, Advanced Algebra, and Trigonometry.

Individual awards and team awards from the Coastal Educational Foundation will be given to the highest three scorers in a respective level. Approximately two hundred participants are expected.

Participation by a student in a contest of this kind, and on a college campus such as ours, is an excellent way to foster interest and to recognize achievement in mathematics.

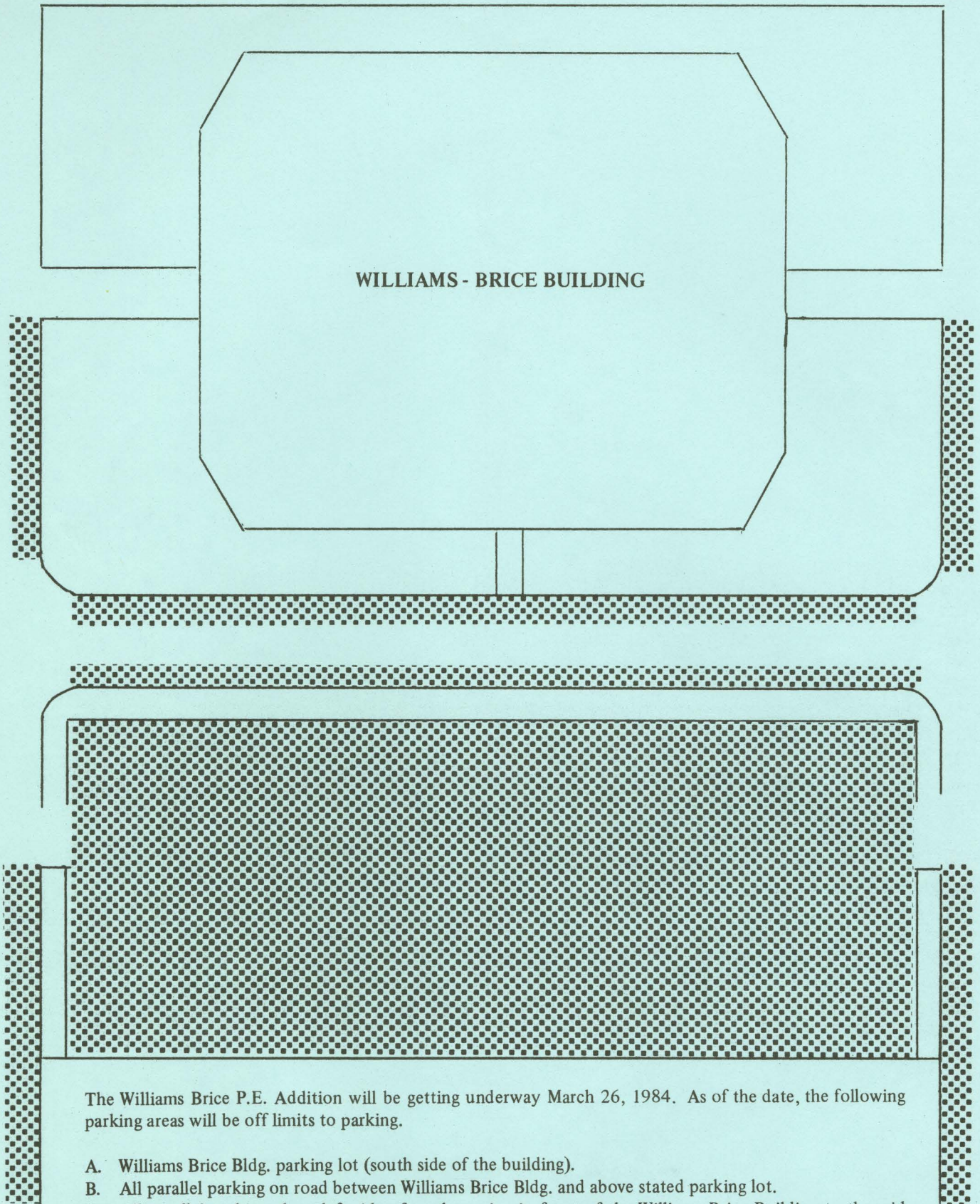
Ed had also been appointed as coach-speaker for the summer national conference of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to be held in Black Mountain, North Carolina.

- A. Williams Brice Bldg. parking lot (south side of the building).
- B. All parallel parking on road between Williams Brice Bldg. and above stated parking lot.
- C. All parallel parking along left side of road running in front of the Williams Brice Building to the mid point of the building (front entrance).
- D. All parallel parking along right side of road running behind the Williams Brice Building to the mid point of the building (rear entrance);
