A total of 626 students participated in Coastal Carolina University's commencement ceremony Saturday at Brooks Stadium.

Coastal Carolina University Board of Trustees approves budget

The Coastal Carolina University Board of Trustees approved a \$105 million operational budget for the 2006-2007 academic year at its quarterly meeting Friday. As part of the budget plan, the board approved a tuition increase, effective for fall 2006. In-state tuition will increase \$320 per semester, from \$3,430 to \$3,750 per semester, an increase of 9.33 percent. Out-of-state tuition will increase \$545 per semester, from \$7,550 to \$8,095, an increase of 7.22 percent. Room, board and health services fees are \$3,345 per semester.

Coastal Carolina University hires new public safety director

Greg Weisner of Spartanburg has been named Coastal Carolina University's chief of public safety, effective May 15. His responsibilities will include the administration of Coastal's Department of Public Safety and the development and administration of the university's fire, safety and hazardous materials program. He also will serve as a liaison between the university and health and safety compliance agencies such as the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).

Greenville businessman Tommy M. Stringer has been appointed to Coastal Carolina University's board of trustees.
