Entitled "Border Crossings: An Exhibit of Drawings and Poetry," the elements of the exhibit are intended to stimulate thought and encourage meditation.

"The works in this exhibit attempt to explore the spiritual potential to transcend the various boundaries that fragment the essential unceasing flow of existence," said McCabe. "In fact, the exhibit itself unfolds at the intersection of the visual, verbal, audio and performing arts and extends itself to incorporate both religious and non-religious expressions of the spiritual dimension."

From 1986 to 1990, she worked with Knight Ridder's Washington, D.C., bureau, where she supervised coverage of the Reagan and Bush administrations, foreign affairs, arms control and national economic policy. Ellis also coordinated the bureau's 1988 presidential campaign coverage.

Ellis serves on the Wall School of Business Board of Visitors, the University of South Carolina College of Journalism and Mass Communications Partnership, the United Way of Horry County Board of Directors and is a founding member of the Waccamaw Community Foundation. She is a member of the American Society of Newspaper Editors and serves on the Board of Directors of the South Carolina Associated Press News Council and the Associated Press Managing Editors.


