### PROFESSORS VISITING USC

The University of South Carolina School of Medicine had been selected by the American Society for Microbiology to receive one of three Wellcome Visiting Professors in Microbiology for the 1983 - 84 Academic Year. As Wellcome Visiting Professor, the School of Medicine will have Thomas C. Merigan, Jr., M.D., George E. and Lucy Becker, Professor of Medicine at Stanford University School of Medicine. Dr. Merigan is head of the Division of infectious Diseases at Stanford and a world leader in interferon research. The highlight of Dr. Merigan's visit will be his presentation on May 3 in the School of Medicine Lecture Hall (on the School of Medicine's new campus on Sumter Highway). The public is cordially invited to attend this lecture, which will be entitled "Interferon Cloned - - Then What." The Wellcome Professorships are sponsored by the Burroughs Wellcome Fund and administered by the American Society for Microbiology.
