Sara Sanders presented two papers, entitled "Writing in Repose" and "The Assessment Challenge," in the Celebration of Honors Teaching session at the annual meeting of the National Collegiate Honors Council Conference held in San Antonio, Texas, Oct. 26-30.

Steve Hamelman published an article in the current issue of *Dirt Rag*, one of the popular mountain biking magazines in the country. In the article, entitled "Blood on the Track," Hamelman recounts an incident in the woods off Highway 501 where he accidentally killed a snake. Hamelman is organizing a mountain biking club at Coastal.

Arlene Adams presented her research, entitled "A Portfolio Assessment Procedure for Preservice Teachers for Admission to the Professional Year," at the annual meeting of the Mid-South Educational Research Association held recently in Nashville, Tenn. This research is being conducted as part of the restructuring efforts currently taking place in the School of Education and the Department of Early Childhood and Elementary Education.

Danny Turner had an article, entitled "Exploring Gerschgorin Circles and Cassini Ovals," published in Mathematica in Education. In this article, the graphical power of Mathematica is used to explore a geometric approach to eigenvalues. Turner coauthored the article with Robert Piziak of Baylor University.

CCU offers East African study safari

Coastal will sponsor a 24-day study safari to Kenya, East Africa, from May 6 to May 31, 1995 to observe and study wildlife and vegetation, the interrelation of organisms with their environment and the stresses caused by population, climate, tourism and habitat destruction. The program is open to the public. Coastal students may earn four credit hours.

Reservations and a deposit of \$1,000 must be received by Jan. 17. A total trip cost of \$3,900 includes all ground transportation in Kenya, park fees, porters, guides, lodge accommodations and meals. The fee also includes group airfare to Nairobi and tuition for CBIO 670. The remaining balance is due by March 20. Trip fees are subject to unexpected airfare increases. Space is limited; registrants will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Faculty members Rich Koesterer and JoAnn Pugh will lead the trip. Koesterer is a zoologist in the biology department and recently returned from a two-year Fulbright Fellowship in Kenya. Pugh is a senior instructor of biology Traveling from the coast and Great Rift Valley to Mt. Kenya (17,000 feet above sea level), the group will visit museums, national parks, hot springs, game reserves and more.

From the Rift Valley, the group will travel to the arid, northern part of the continent through sandy plains to a terrain of volcanic rock with little vegetation. Elephant, zebra, oryx, ostrich, cheetah, leopard, hyena and baboon species will be observed at the Samburu Game Reserve in the southern part of the country.

Three days will be spent hiking to the summit of Mt. Kenya. The botanical trail is filled with juniper, bamboo forests, and alpine moorlands of plantlife.

The trip will conclude with an overnight train ride to the coastal Mombasa and three days of snorkeling over tropical reefs in the Indian Ocean.

Participants will camp in national parks and game reserves with minimal facilities.

Faculty, staff and alumni invited to travel to England this summer

Coastal will sponsor a 10-day trip for alumni to Oxford, England, from July 10 to July 21. The program is an offshoot of the original 22-day study trip for students that began seven years ago.

The application deadline is Thursday, Dec. 15. Space is limited; registrants will be accepted on a firstcome, first-serve basis.

Participants will live at Manchester College, located in the historic heart of Oxford. Manchester College is one of 33 colleges that comprise Oxford University.

Participants will visit the Tower of London, Windsor Castle, Blenheim Palace, Stonehenge, Winchester and other sites related to individual interest. The final two days of the trip will be spent in London and will include visits to Buckingham Palace, the Houses of Parliament, St. Paul's Cathedral, Covent Gardens and Westminster Abbey.

The group also will see three plays and go on a boating expedition of the
