Urquhart family gift will help fund field house at CCU's Brooks Stadium

Gary and Brenda Spadoni Urquhart of Myrtle Beach have made a \$150,000 gift to Coastal Carolina University to help fund the proposed athletic field house project on campus. The field house, designed for the north end of Brooks Stadium, will serve as headquarters for the university athletic departments. The \$8.6 million, 43,000-square foot facility will house coaches' offices, a 9,000 square-foot weight room, locker rooms, meeting rooms, an academic study lounge and 2,100 additional seats in the end zone in the front of the building. The Buddy Sasser Athletic Hall of Fame will also be a prominent feature of the new building.
