Presidential Search campus forums held

A series of forums have been held on campus over the summer months on Coastal's presidential search.

Forums remaining in August will provide an opportunity for faculty and students to voice their opinions on what attributes the next president should have. The time and place will be announced soon.

The executive search firm has been conducting the meetings; the firm works closely with the 12-person search committee that will ultimately make the recommendation to the board of trustees. Comments made in the meetings are recorded anonymously with respect to individuals and the areas they represent.

Last week's staff meeting included discussion of whether the new president should be from the South or South Carolina, the importance of vision, team building and community involvement.
