Coastal Carolina will recognize 329 degree candidates during commencement exercises Saturday, May 6 at 10 a.m. at the campus soccer stadium. The public is welcome.

Clemson University President Philip H. Prince will deliver the commencement address.

Catherine H. Lewis and R. Cathcart Smith will receive honorary degrees.

Lewis was head librarian for the Horry County Memorial Library for 37 years, and was librarian at Coastal Carolina Junior College from 1958 to 1960.

As part of his more than 40 years of service to Coastal Carolina University, Smith served as a member of the university's first Board of Trustees. He held this position from July 1993 to March 1995. Smith is a retired physician.

In case of inclement weather, the commencement ceremony will be held in Kimbel Gymnasium; a closed-circuit broadcast also will be shown in Wheelwright Auditorium. Rain tickets for admission to the gymnasium will be issued to degree candidates prior to rehearsal Friday, May 5. ♦

## Coastal student selected for NASA internship

Coastal sophomore Heidi Zeleznik of Poughkeepsie, N.Y., has been selected to participate in NASA's 1995 Space Life Sciences Training Program at Florida A&M University in Tallahassee, Fla., this summer. Zeleznik is majoring in mathematics and marine science.

Zeleznik is one of 40 students selected from a pool of 403 students from the United States to participate in the six-week program which begins in June.

The internship is limited to upperclassmen

majoring in mathematics who are interested in mathematics and scientific research.

Zeleznik will work with research faculty at Florida A&M University who conduct collaborative research with NASA. Student interns will participate in academic lessons and work on several projects. Faculty will mentor students.

All expenses, including air fare, are paid by NASA as part of the program. ♦

## Spring 1995 WAVE courses announced

Coastal will offer a variety of short, informal and informative courses on topics of local interest several times a year as part of a new program introduced by the Center for Marine and Wetland Studies. The program, Waccamaw and Atlantic Varied Education Program—WAVE, will be presented by university faculty and students, area businesses, parks and museums, and expert individuals.

Course offerings in the spring pilot program are described below.

• **Finding Fossils** — Saturday, April 15 • 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Visit two productive fossil pits and learn about the geological history of South Carolina's coastal plain while you dig for and learn to identify fossils. *Course fees:*

\$16 per person, \$13 for seniors, \$13 for children under age 16 accompanied by an adult. *Instructor:* Don Kirkpatrick, earth science teacher, research associate with the Horry County Museum.

• **Coastal Birding**

— Saturday, April 15 • 1 to 4 p.m. Spend an afternoon at Huntington Beach State Park spotting and studying such birds as egrets, herons, shorebirds, raptors and more. *Course fees:* Course fees waived; however, park admission is necessary: \$3 per adult, \$1.50 for children ages 6 to 12. *Instructor:* Steve Roff, Huntington Beach State Park interpreter.

Powell is the conductor for Vocal Edition, one of the premier vocal ensembles of South Carolina. Vocal Edition will be performing at the Temple Emanuel of Myrtle Beach on Saturday, April 22 at 8 p.m. The performance will feature music from the Renaissance to current Broadway favorites.

Powell serves on the board of directors for the Long Bay Symphony and is past president of the Coastal Concert Association. He is founder and director of Coastal's *Musical de Genève* series, which has featured artists such as Ignat Solzhenitsyn, Chicako Shibata, Maria Schleuning, Denis Pascal and SungWon Yang.

Powell was recently appointed music director for the Pawleys Island Music Festival.

Powell received his undergraduate degree from Oklahoma University and his master's and doctoral degrees from Indiana University, where he was a student of Michel Block. A Coastal faculty member since 1988, Powell teaches piano, conducting, piano pedagogy and music literature.

The agenda for the task force is to 1) consider the proposed statewide general education transfer module for meeting general education requirements in all undergraduate teacher education programs to which a student might transfer within the public institutions of South Carolina, 2) develop a common agreement to prevent loss of either professional or general education credits for all students transferring from two-year public technical colleges and the two-year regional campuses of the University of South Carolina, and 3) develop in that same common agreement provisions which will prevent loss of credit for any student transferring from one accredited four-year to any other accredited four-year teacher education program in the State's public institutions. The task force represents the State's major institutions, four-year teaching institutions, and the two-year sector of both the University of South Carolina and the technical college system. ♦

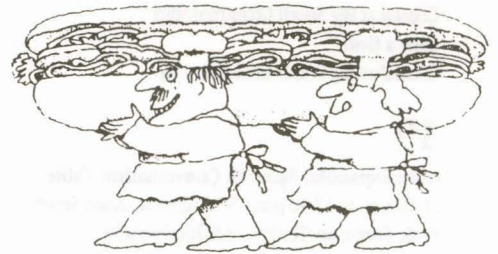
