REBELS AND REDCOATS TOUR BEGINS JUNE 22

"Rebels and Redcoats," an old South history tour of South Carolina's Waccamaw region, will be sponsored June 22, July 20 and August 17 by USC-Coastal Carolina College. The tour includes Hobcaw Barony, a 17,000-acre wildlife preserve; Hopsewee Plantation, colonial home of Thomas Lynch, Jr.; the church of Prince George of Winyah; the Horry County Museum; and other sites.

Tuition is \$35 for adults and \$20 for children under 18. Senior citizens above 60 receive a 10% discount.

CIRCULATION POLICY CHANGE IN KIMBEL LIBRARY

Effective immediately, patrons who are not affiliated with USC-Coastal Carolina must use library materials in the building. Borrowing privileges are restricted to Coastal faculty, and staff, faculty and staff spouses and children, students, alumni association members, Coastal graduates, scholars approved by the library director, Commission and Foundation members and college donors and honorees. Members of these categories are asked to identify themselves as such to circulation desk staff.

This decision was based on two factors: the loss of over \$6,000 worth of books checked out by non-students during the past year and increases in circulation which have strained several areas of the collection, especially literature and the social sciences.

SURFING CLASS SET FOR COASTAL

Two classes in basic surfing will be offered July 2-26, through the Office of Continuing Education. Mark Allison, director of the Eastern Surfing Association for the Northern South Carolina District, will teach both Monday and Thursday evening classes. This classroom course for beginners features a textbook, videotapes and discussion about surfboards and surfing techniques.
