USC SYSTEM NEWS

Dean Jack Whitener of Union and Dean John Powers of Lifelong Learning will be retiring after years of dedicated and excellent service to their respective units.

Dr. Ken Davis currently acting Chairman of the Hotel Restaurant Tourism Administration Program in the College of Applied Professional Science, will be assuming the position of Dean of the University at USC-Union on July 1, 1984. Dr. Davis earned his B.S. and Ph.D. degrees in Psychology at USC.

He began his teaching career as an instructor in the College of General Studies in September 1970. He has served as Acting Chairman of the Department of CORE courses in the College; as Chairman of the Department of Criminal Justice in the College of Applied Professional Sciences. He was recently promoted to Associate Professor in Psychology with tenure at Union.

Dr. John May, currently Director of Continuing and Evening Education at USC-Spartanburg, will be assuming the position of Dean for Lifelong Learning on July 30, 1984. Dr. May earned his undergraduate degree from USC, and his graduate degrees from The University of Alabama. His doctorate is in Administration and Higher Education with specialization in Adult/Continuing Education.

He began his career as the Coordinator of Special Programs in the Division of Continuing Education at the University of Alabama. He began his career with USC as Director of Continuing and Evening Education at USC-Spartanburg in 1978, and has actively continued working with Continuing Education since. Last summer he directed the Statewide Computer Camp program for the Division.
