**Mollie Fout** has completed the Summer Institute for Women in Higher Education sponsored by Bryn Mawr College and Higher Education Resource Services (HERS). The residential program was held June 25 to July 21 on the Bryn Mawr campus in Pennsylvania. The purpose of the institute is to improve the status of women at the middle and executive levels of higher education administration. Participants learn skills in the management and governance of colleges and universities in the area of teaching, research and service. The curriculum places special emphasis on the growing diversity of both the student body and the work force.
