DR. ELINOR MILLER APPOINTED CHIEF ACADEMIC OFFICER AND VICE CHANCELLOR FOR ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

Dr. Elinor Miller has been appointed Chief Academic Officer and Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs. She will be second-in-command at USC-Coastal Carolina College.

Dr. Miller comes from the State College of Maryland at St. Mary's, where she chaired the Division of Arts and Letters. Dr. Miller received her B.A. degree in French and German from Wesleyan College, Macon, Ga.; an M.A. degree in French from the University of Chicago; and a Ph.D. in French language and literature from the University of Chicago.

Dr. Miller has been a faculty member at Shimer College in Mt. Carroll, Ill., and associate professor at Temple Buell College in Denver, Colorado; and an associate professor at Rollins College in Winter Park, Fla, before taking the post at the State College of Maryland at St. Mary's.

Dr. Miller was selected by the Search Committee, chaired by Dr. Dennis Wiseman, Dean of the School of Education, after a national search that brought in over 250 applications and nominations. Dr. Miller has been appointed by USC-Coastal Carolina College Chancellor Fred Hicks and University of South Carolina President James B. Holderman.

BROADWAY ON CAMPUS

The 1984-85 Coastal Carolina Theatre Season will bring outstanding performances and plays to the college this year. Starting the season is: Amadeus, a Tony-award winning play about a speculative meeting between composers Antonio Salieri and Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. Thomas E. Jones will direct the play, which runs October 19, 20 and 21. Seascape by Edward Albee will be performed November 9, 10 and 11, directed by David E. Majewski. Set on a deserted beach, a middle-aged couple encounters two sea creatures contemplating life outside of their ocean world. Jay Thompson's Once Upon A Mattress is scheduled December 7, 8 and 9. Playwright Thompson will direct his uproarious Broadway hit. Arthur Miller's A View From The Bridge will run February 22, 23 and 24, directed by Majewski. Carolyn Cox will direct the Gilbert and Sullivan opera, H.M.S. Pinafore, March 29, 30 and 31. The Pulitzer Prize winning play, Crimes of The Heart, will be directed by Thomas E. Jones April 26, 27 and 28. The Beth Henley play examines the plight of three young Mississippi sisters betrayed by their passions.

The students will select courses in computer science, photography, television production, marine biology, chemistry, musical drama, creative writing, ceramics, drawing/painting, tennis, gymnastics and basketball.

Dr. Dennis Wiseman, dean of the school of education, said selected courses will be offered to the rising fourth graders for the first time. He added that faculty from Coastal, experienced teachers from Horry County, and area experts will teach the subjects.
