### FREE CONCERT

Acclaimed pianist Andreas Klein, the founder and artistic director of the Natchez Music Festival, will perform at Wheelwright Auditorium at 11 a.m. Tuesday. Klein, who was a student of the world-famous pianist Claudio Arrau, is a faculty member at Texas Christian University in Fort Worth. He is a graduate of the prestigious Juilliard School in New York and presented debut recitals in New York's Carnegie Recital Hall, London's Wigmore Hall, Bern's Casino and Berlin's Philharmonic Hall. The pianist has performed in major cities as a recitalist and soloist with major orchestras in his native Germany. He also has performed frequently in England, France, Switzerland, Italy and the United States. In 1981, Klein was invited by the Italian Minister of Education to present recitals in Rome, Milan, Bologna, Turin and other cities.
