GARNER JOINS BOARD OF VISITORS

Mark Garner, an Horry County businessman and civic leader, is joining the Board of Visitors of USC-Coastal Carolina College's School of Business.

Garner is a member of Coastal Council, Horry County Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee, was a member of Myrtle Beach City Council, and was mayor of the city from 1966 to 1974. Garner also served on Santee Cooper's Board for seven years, and now chairs the Leadership Grand Strand Board of Regents.

The former publisher and newspaper owner started The Sun in 1950 and purchased The Myrtle Beach News in 1970. He sold both newspapers in 1973 to The State-Record Company, and is on the publishing company's board of directors.

The board of visitors, chaired by Clyde Port, will advise and consult with the School of Business' dean and faculty about curriculum, new programs, courses and external seminars.

ON BOARD OF REGENTS

Sally Hare, director of Graduate Studies and Continuing Education at USC-Coastal Carolina College, has been elected vice chairperson of the Leadership Grand Strand Board of Regents.

The Leadership Grand Strand program conducts an intensive study in Horry County government, history, education and service organizations. Mark Garner chairs the board.

DR. SALLY HORNER NAMED CHIEF FISCAL OFFICER

Dr. Sally Melvin Horner has been appointed Chief Fiscal Officer and Vice Chancellor for Administrative Services at USC-Coastal Carolina College, completing the administrative changes at the college. Before her appointment by Chancellor Fred Hicks and University of South Carolina President James B. Holderman, Dr. Horner was Senior Vice President and Chief Operating Officer at the University of Charleston in West Virginia. During her years as Vice-President for Finance and Administration, the university's budget was balanced for the first time in its 10-year history.

'Dr. Horner's background as an academic, an administrator, a fiscal officer and researcher corresponds with Coastal Carolina College's goals and rapid growth, both in academic programs and in physical expansion,' said Chancellor Hicks.

Dr. Horner has a B.S. degree in chemistry and Ph.D in inorganic chemistry from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She has been chairman of the department of chemistry at Meredith College in Raleigh, N.C., a four-year liberal arts college for women; and an instructor at UNC-Chapel Hill.

She has been a consultant with UNC-Chapel Hill, and with the internationally-known Research Triangle Park. As Provost at the University of Charleston, Dr. Horner developed a proposal that brought the accreditation of the university's first master's degree program.
