DANNELLY NAMED ASSISTANT ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Jess Dannely has been named assistant athletic director and assistant baseball coach. Dannelly will assume the new post August 1. Dannelly has been with USC-Salkehatchie for nine years as athletic director and baseball coach. During his career with that college, Dannelly had over 230 wins and had three teams become regional runners-up. Five of his players entered professional baseball. The Ehrhardt, S.C. native attended USC-Salkehatchie and received a B.S. degree in physical education and health from the University of South Carolina-Columbia in 1974. While at USC, Dannelly was an undergraduate coach when Coastal Carolina College Athletic Director Bobby Richardson coached that university's baseball team, which was ranked second in the nation in 1975. "Jess Dannelly will be the one to come in and help establish the total athletic program here at Coastal Carolina College, and especially in baseball as he sits on three junior college national committees," Richardson said.

Dr. Dennis Wiseman, dean of the School of Education, has been elected president of the Coastal Carolina chapter of Phi Delta Kappa, an international professional organization of educators.

- Dr. Richard Dame recently attended the annual meeting of the National Shellfisheries Association in Tampa, Fla., where he presented a paper entitled "Nutritional Processing By Intertidal Oyster Reefs." The paper presented evidence that oyster reefs are major sources of ammonia and significant removers of suspended material in coastal waters.
- Dr. Douglas Nelson visited with the U.S. Geological Survey in Washington, D.C. to discuss the analysis of off-shore bottom sediments in the southeast as sources for heavy minerals. This project is part of a major plan to determine the possible location of significant concentrations of heavy minerals.
- James Matthew Nicholson, computer operator, went to Atlanta for the AT&T Conference on the utility's new telephone switch system.
- Oastal Carolina College, was the subject of a recent article by The Associated Press. The article detailed Gordon's search for the Spanish shipwreck, La Bretona, which left Santo Domingo in 1525 to colonize the Carolinas. Gordon, who teaches history at the Georgetown Education Center and is a retired Naval officer, plans to apply for a grant from the National Geographic Society to investigate six possible sites of the shipwreck. Gordon's search for the shipwreck would be between Wilmington, N.C. and Santee, which is 13 miles south of Georgetown, the article reported.
