CCU gets grant for research symposium

Coastal Carolina University has been selected for support of its grant proposal entitled "The First Big South Undergraduate Research Symposium" in the amount \$4,920, according to the South Carolina EPSCoR/IDeA Program.

Coastal Carolina will be the first host of this new initiative involving nine Big South Athletic Conference universities. It will give all undergraduate students from the representative schools the opportunity to present their research during the two-day symposium to be held on Coastal's campus March 23 and 24, 2007. Charmaine Tomczyk is the principle investigator for this grant and the director of the symposium. Valgene Dunham is the grant's co-PI and will coordinate reviewing of the symposium abstracts.

Universities participating in the symposium are Coastal, UNC-Asheville, Virginia Military Institute, High Point University, Radford University, Winthrop University, Presbyterian College, Charleston Southern University and Liberty University.
