CERTIFICATE PROGRAM IN COMPUTER SCIENCES

A certificate program in computer science is being offered at USC-Coastal Carolina College this fall to meet the needs of business personnel, educators, students, teachers and others interested in handson computer instruction. Twelve semester hours are earned to be eligible to receive the certificate. Registration begins today. To complete the course sequence in one calendar year, BASIC programming may be taken this fall. RESEARCH AND PRODUCTIVE SCHOLARSHIP

The University of South Carolina Office of Sponsored Programs and Research is offering a Research and Productive Scholarship for permanent faculty members of all USC campuses.

The reviewing committee will observe the following criteria when judging applications:

*Grant proposals are expected to range between \$300 to \$3,000 and the committee will attempt to fund as many proposals as possible.

*Faculty from the two- and four-year campuses are encouraged to submit proposals.

*Prior attempts by the applicant to secure outside funding will not prejudice the proposal under consideration.

*Major thrust of funding will be directed toward development of new scholarship.

*Grants will not be made to faculty who have active R&PS grants.

*Funding for summer salary is not possible because of funding limitations.

*Funding will be for one year, to begin as requested.
