Kimbel Library has implemented a new statewide borrowing program called "PASCAL Delivers" whereby any student, faculty or staff member can borrow books from academic libraries in South Carolina and receive them in just three days.

Here's how to request books from PASCAL Delivers:

1. Go to the PASCAL Delivers catalog from Kimbel Library
2. Search the catalog by title, author, keyword or subject.
3. Click on a title of interest to learn more about it, or just "Request This Item."
4. Use the drop-down menu to authenticate your association with CCU.
5. Enter your name and 7 digit CCU ID number (found on your CCU ID.)
6. That's it -- You will receive an e-mail when your book arrives.
7. Pick up your book at Kimbel Library's circulation desk.
