#### TV NEWSMAN HOWARD K. SMITH TO SPEAK AT COASTAL

Award-winning broadcast journalist Howard K. Smith will be the Kimbel Distinguished Lecture Series speaker at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 2. There is no admission charge. The television newsman moderated at two debates that were said to have had significant impacts on elections: the first Kennedy-Nixon debate and the Carter-Reagan "Great Debate." Howard K. Smith covered four armies during World War II, and was evicted from Germany by the Nazi forces. He was with CBS for 20 years, and has been with ABC since 1961. The former foreign correspondent and news anchor is known for his sharp commentaries.

#### CLEARY TO SPEAK

Professor Claudia Cleary of the School of Humanities will speak at the Coastal Carolina College Chapter of Phi Delta Kappa at 7 p.m. Thursday. The professor will speak on "Philosophy in the Schools," which in part will detail a grant received by the college from the South Carolina Committee For the Humanities.
