Richard Dame

Dr. Richard Dame, chairman of marine science, recently presented a paper at the "Nutrients in Estuaries" meeting in Texel, The Netherlands. The meeting was held at the Netherlands Institute for Sea Research, which is the Dutch national marine laboratory. Scientists from across the world spent four days listening to talks and discussing the nutrient chemistry of estuaries. Dr. Dame's paper focused on the uptake and release of nitrogen by oyster reefs and the impact of these reefs on estuaries. The paper was well received and will be published in the "Netherlands Journal of Sea Research." In addition, Dr. Dame visited the Dutch Natural Resources Institute and was invited to return to conduct studies on the mussel beds in the North Sea.
