# Marketing survey results

Recently the Office of Marketing Communications conducted an opinion survey assessing the Coastal Carolina University newsletter. The newsletter is sent to approximately 18,000 e-mail addresses belonging to faculty, staff, students, alumni and friends of the university. Respondents were asked to rate their satisfaction with the contents, design and usefulness of the newsletter. Other questions addressed how often respondents read the newsletter, their interest in receiving it more often, and satisfaction with the electronic version of the newsletter. Following are some key findings from the survey:

- \* 84 percent of all respondents read the newsletter sometimes or every week.
- \* Two-thirds of respondents were satisfied or extremely satisfied with the design of the newsletter.

- \* 85 percent of respondents were satisfied or extremely satisfied with receiving the newsletter electronically.
- \* 13 percent of faculty members and 8 percent of staff members were not satisfied at all with receiving the newsletter electronically.
- \* 70 percent of respondents find the newsletter useful or extremely useful.
- \* 75 percent of respondents had limited or no interest in receiving the newsletter more often than once a week.

Aside from structured multiple-choice questions the survey contained an open comment box. Many respondents offered comments, suggestions and critiques that will enable the Marketing Communications staff to make improvements and additions that are essential in enhancing the newsletter. Some respondents recommended adding pictures and video to the newsletter, an HTML formatted e-mail with more attractive visual elements (i.e. different fonts and colors), and the addition of faculty and staff birthdays. (HREO is now listing faculty and staff birthdays on the password-protected Workplace site.)
