Parking lots repaving starts today

Beginning Tuesday, May 8, Facilities Management will begin a parking lot repair, resurfacing and resealing project that affects the following parking lots: Lots AA, BB, CC, EE and Township Circle (all these lots are around the residence halls, the Woods and the Rivers). Also, Lot E at the Student Center to include Spadoni Park Circle, Lot II between Kingston Hall and University Hall, Lot HH across from the Smith Science Center and Lot LL at the Student Health Center. Each parking lot will be closed for a minimum of two days for the seal coat to dry and for the striping to be painted. The schedule follows: Monday/Tuesday, May 7 and 8, Lot LL and Lot E Tuesday/Wednesday, May 8 and 9, Lot HH Wednesday/Thursday, May 9 and 10, Lot II Friday/Saturday, May 11 and 12, Lot AA & CC Monday/Tuesday, May 14 and 15, Lot BB Wednesday/Thursday, May 16 and 17, Lot EE, including Township Circle With good weather, the project should be complete by Friday, May 18.
