FULBRIGHT PROGRAM FELLOWSHIPS FOR UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATORS

Administrators at four-year colleges and universities are eligible to apply for three fellowships for an exchange program with the United Kingdom. The fellowships are through the Fulbright Program, which is funded by the United States Information Agency. Comparative projects which are not based in the central administration of British universities and projects which are research-oriented and not primarily for purposes of administrative exchange will not be considered.
