## FACULTY/STAFF

Bruno Gujer was invited to present a talk on "Slavery in the American South" during a visit with colleagues at the University of Zurich, Switzerland, which is his alma mater. Dr. Gujer's seminar was part of Prof. Urs Bitteli's seminar on "Cross-cultural contacts in history." On Jan. 3-5, Dr. Gujer attended the annual meeting of International Student Exchange Program (ISEP) coordinators at Plymouth Polytechnic in Plymouth, England.

Richard Dame recently presented an invited lecture to the biology department of the University of Texas-Arlington. Dr. Dame spoke on the flux of materials (nutrients) in a tidal estuary. Dr. Dame also attended the winter meeting of the American Society of Limnology and Oceanography in San Francisco. At this meeting, he was a participant in a symposium on New Perspectives in Aquatic Nitrogen Cycling. He presented a paper on the "Uptake and Release of Nitrogen by Oyster Reefs: A Possible Case of Animals Controlling Plants." During his trip to California, Dr. Dame visited the University of California at Davis and consulted with ecologists there on Landscape Ecology in the Coastal Zone. Dr. Dame also recently presented a talk to the American Association of Retired Persons on Beach Erosion.

Ann Finch, instructor in the School of Nursing, attended the National League of Nursing First Annual Conference on Nursing Education. The conference was held in Philadelphia, Pa., in early December. Topics focused on the unfolding patterns in nursing education.
