Coastal Federal Field will be the site of the NCAA Myrtle Beach Regional June 1-4. Coastal Carolina is one of 16 schools hosting regionals next week. The Chanticleers will find out who they will play Monday, May 28 at 12:30 p.m.

**Men's Track's Simpson Qualifies for NCAA Championships in Long Jump**

The two-sport standout for the Chanticleers finished third in the long jump at the NCAA East Regionals in Gainesville, Fla., earning a place in the event at the NCAA Championships. Sophomore Tyrone Murphy was 25th in the 400-meter hurdles.

**BIG SOUTH BASEBALL TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS**

The Coastal Carolina University baseball team scored two times in the seventh inning, including a game-winning home run by Dom Duggan, as the Chanticleers defeated Liberty 6-5 in the Big South Tournament championship game May 26. Travis Risser pitched three innings of relief to earn the win, while Nick McCully picked up his second save of the tournament. It is the eighth Big South Tournament championship for Coastal and the first time since 2002 the Chanticleers won both the regular-season and tournament title.

**Football Alum Poston Selected To Play For Team USA at World Championship of American Football**

The offensive lineman was picked to play for the U.S. in the nation's first-ever appearance in the international championship, being played July 7-15 in Kawasaki, Japan.
