**Jo-Ann Morgan's** book, "'Uncle Tom's Cabin' as Visual Culture" was recently published by the University of Missouri Press. The book examines illustrations for the original editions of Harriet Beecher Stowe's 1852 novel as well as representations of its characters as they appeared in oil paintings, on sheet music, posters, and in later book illustrations. Morgan considers these pictures within a framework of social conditions and political events on the eve of the Civil War and into the 20th century. Morgan will be leaving Coastal in July to take a position as associate professor of art history at Western Illinois University in Macomb.
