

INCREASE IN COVERAGE

The State Budget and Control Board approved an increase in coverage with no increase in premium for the State Metropolitan Optional Life Program. The coverage increase was effective Nov. 1, 1984. SAY GOODBYE TO COLUMBIA LINES TEMPORARILY

From March 8-18, long distance (65 or 63) will be temporarily interrupted while USC-Columbia's new telephone system is installed. Upon reconnection, two additional tie-lines to Columbia will be available for long distance calling. Long distance personal calls are not to be made from the campus. The Columbia campus will correlate all telephone calls by extension numbers and these will be available for cost center directors to evaluate telephone usages in their areas. For January, toll charges exceeded the prior cost of toll and equipment rental. The college community is asked to refrain from using the 7 or 9 access to make long distance calls except in emergencies.
