Professor Jeanne Cobb recently attended the International Reading Association

conference in Toronto, Ontario, where she was part of a research symposium. While there, she received an Outstanding Journal Article Award in the research category from the Organization of Teacher Educators. The organization selects the most outstanding articles in three categories for each year. Her article, entitled "High Stakes Testing, Accountability, and Prescribed Direct Systematic Phonics Instruction: A Comparison of Struggling Readers Attending a University Reading Clinic Before and After State Mandated Testing," was published in the fall 2006 issue of the *Journal of Reading Education* and was selected as the Outstanding Research Article for the academic year 2006-2007. Cobb is chair of the Department of Elementary Education, Special Education, and Reading for the Spadoni College of Education.

Five students in the MAT program in the College of Education and one recent graduate of the program recently participated in an online videoconference from University Hall on the Coastal campus with Russian university students at the All-Russian Exhibition Center in Moscow, Russia. The theme of the conference was "Young Professionals' Knowledge, Skills, Abilities and Attitudes as a Foundation for Employment and Career Success." The videoconference that linked the All-Russian Exhibition Center with Coastal represented a further development of Coastal's international activities in Russia. Approximately three years ago Coastal established a partnership with Russian State Social University in Moscow. Cooperative efforts have produced professional products in the form of books, journal articles, and student and faculty presentations. Participants in the conference included Dennis G. Wiseman, associate provost and director of graduate studies (moderator); Jason Schipper (M.A.T. social studies graduate); Tripp Hartley (M.A.T. social studies candidate); Joshua Cutright (M.A.T. social studies candidate); Adam Lord (M.A.T. social studies candidate); Kari Brown (M.A.T. science candidate); and Samantha Lohr (M.A.T. social studies candidate).

Jean-Louis Lassez presented a talk, "Ku naru shomei no michi (The way of the empty proof)," at a computer science conference held at Hokkaido University last week. This talk was partially based on work done with **Kumar Jeev** while he was an undergraduate student at Coastal and **Ryan Ross**, a second year student in the Department of Computer Science.
