BROOKGREEN WILDLIFE WALK

Dr. Joseph Pinson of Coastal Carolina College's Biology Department will conduct a Low Country Wildlife Walk at Brookgreen Gardens as a part of the South Carolina State Parks Lowland Wildflower Weekend April 13.

Brookgreen Gardens, in Georgetown County is 18 miles south of Myrtle Beach on U.S. 17. It is dedicated to preserving the flora and fauna of the area and to collecting and displaying sculpture in an outdoor setting. The casual visitor to these gardens is seldom aware of the many acres of natural woodland that surrounds the developed area. An easy walk requiring about 2½ hours will take you through a hardwood forest, an old rice field and other habitats located here. (You may get your feet wet.)

The walk will begin at 1:30 p.m. from the south end of the parking area for sculpture Gardens (away from Visitors Center).

The registration fee is \$3 per person. Please make checks payable to S.C. State Parks and mail to Programs Section, S.C. State Parks, 1205 Pendleton Stree, Columbia, SC 29201. Also note that it is for the Brookgreen Gardens Lowlands Wildflower Trip.
